Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely All India Institute Of Ayurveda, MRPP+QW9, Dargalim, Goa-403519 (Inst. ID AYU0806) inspection of your College was conducted on 26.02.2024 & 27.02.2024 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the 2nd Renewal of Permission with 100 seats (including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022; provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
- 3. Thereafter, the assessment report was placed in the 96th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 05.07.2024. On careful examination of the assessment report it was found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria for issuance of 2nd Renewal of Permission for intake capacity of 100 seats (including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 and the Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college. Accordingly, the hearing was conducted on 11.07.2024.

- 4. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016" provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **98th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **19.07.2024.** On careful examination of the report it is found that **your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria.**
- 5. Further, the Board discussed and decided to ask an undertaking regarding the shortcomings and your college has submitted the undertaking vide ref. no. Z-25009/3/2024 AIIAGOA/127 dated 26.07.2024, in response to Board's letter vide even number dated 25.07.2024.
- 6. Hence the Board decided to issue 2nd Renewal of Permission with 100 seats (including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.
- 7. Therefore, 2nd Renewal of Permission is issued to All India Institute Of Ayurveda, MRPP+QW9, Dargalim, Goa-403519 (Inst. ID AYU0806) with intake capacity of 100 seats (including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 subject to fulfill the conditions which is as under: -
 - I. It is further informed that minimum 50% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats (including EWS) shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 50% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act& Regulations thereunder.
- 9. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 11. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 4 above, should be fulfilled.
- 12. The College administration shall ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of the 4th batch of student in the 1st professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.

- 13. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- 14. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.

Z-25009/3/2024 AIIA GOA/168 dated 29.08.2024 on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, nonteaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely All India Institute of Ayurveda, North Goa, Dhargal, Pernem, Goa (AYU0806) to start 05 new Post Graduate courses with 20 seats (including EWS) in the subjects namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita & Siddhant-04 seats (including EWS) (ii) Kriya Sharir-04 seats (including EWS) (iii) Rachana Sharir-03 seats (including EWS) (iv) Agada Tantra-06 seats (including EWS) (v) Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana-03 seats (including EWS) visitation has been carried out for issuance of Letter of Intent (LOI) on 10.10.2024 & 11.10.2024 through hybrid mode by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM) and Letter of Intent (LOI) has been issued to your college vide letter of even no. dated 18.10.2024 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2024-25.
- 2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the college again on 28.10.2024 & 29.10.2024 through hybrid mode to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure for issuance of Letter of Permission to start 05 new Post Graduate courses with 20 seats (including EWS) in the subjects namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita & Siddhant-04 seats (including EWS) (ii) Kriya Sharir-04 seats (including EWS) (iii) Rachana Sharir-03 seats (including EWS) (iv) Agada Tantra-06 seats (including EWS) (v) Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana-03 seats (including EWS) from the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020.

- 3. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On careful examination of the assessment report, it was found that **your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria due to the following short comings.**
 - a) Animal house is not available.
 - b) Central Research laboratory is not available.
 - c) Total no. of beds available are 20 and there is a shortcoming of 80 beds.
- 4. Hence, it has been decided to ask for clarification regarding the above mentioned shortcomings and same was communicated to the college vide an email **dated 04.11.2024**. In response of the same, you have submitted the asked documents via email dated 04.11.2024.
- 5. Further, it has been decided to issue Letter of Permission to start 05 new Post Graduate courses with 20 seats (including EWS) in the subjects namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita & Siddhant-04 seats (including EWS), (ii) Kriya Sharir-04 seats (including EWS) (iii) Rachana Sharir-03 seats (including EWS) (iv) Agada Tantra-06 seats (including EWS) (v) Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana-03 seats (including EWS) under Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2024-25 and same was approved subject to ratification in the ensuing Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
- 6. Therefore, Letter of Permission is issued to All India Institute of Ayurveda, North Goa, Dhargal, Pernem, Goa (AYU0806) to start 05 new Post Graduate courses with 20 seats (including EWS) in the subjects namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita & Siddhant-04 seats (including EWS) (ii) Kriya Sharir-04 seats (including EWS) (iii) Rachana Sharir-03 seats (including EWS) (iv) Agada Tantra-06 seats (including EWS) (v) Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana-03 seats (including EWS) from the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to following conditions-

 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.

- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- iv) All the requirements of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations, 2024.
- v) The short comings mentioned in point no 3 above should be fulfilled.
- 11. This permission to start 05 new PG course with 20 seats (including EWS) from the academic session 2024-25 as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2024-25 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.
- 12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine.
